

Residents and heritage buffs urge for underpass near Pattanam site

Without it, people have to travel quite a distance before taking a U-turn to reach the village

AS THE WORK of the NH-66 bypass moves ahead albeit at a slow pace, a demand has been made by the residents and also those working for the protection and conservation of heritage sites seeking the construction of an underpass near the historical site of Pattanam.

Speaking about the need to construct the underpass, P J Cherian, who is the chief in charge of the research activities conducted under the leadership of the Kerala Council for Historical Research (KCHR) from 2007 to 2015 and PAMA since 2019, says, "Considering the location of the archaeological village, the town gains international importance. Hence, the demand for an underpass at the town junction is quite justified."

He says, "It is also our commitment to the future potential of the archaeological site in the town. We have been able to find irrefutable evidence of the global sea trade that had been active at Pattanam village nearly 2,000 years ago. The sea trade happened between 300 BC and 300 AD. Over 67 excavations

that were conducted between 2007 and 2022 have uncovered evidence of exchanges with regions that spoke 40 different languages. Today the world has recognised the fact that the town is the ideal location for the global port of Muziris."

Cherian urged the authorities concerned to consider the demand wholeheartedly.

"Providing the infrastructure that would pave way for the better connectivity to this

historical site would be doing justice to not only the future generations but also the ancestors. While the future generation will get to see and learn how things were in ancient times, road connectivity will help towards study, conservation and protection of the site," he adds.

Woman gets 3-year jail term for cheating

A woman who helped her husband deceive a young woman through a fake marriage, following a matrimonial advertisement in newspapers, and extorted ₹5 lakh from the victim's mother has been sentenced to three years imprisonment and a fine of ₹5.5 lakh. The Additional Sessions (VI) Judge, C K Madhusoodhanan,

issued the verdict against Vineetha, 44, the second accused in the case, for cheating a young woman from Chambakkara, Kochi.

The couple was arrested when they arrived at the Chambakkara market, where the victim's mother worked as a fish vendor, to demand more money. Vineetha's husband, Rajeev, was the first accused. The couple pretended to be siblings

when they approached the victim and her family. They then took the young woman and her mother to a temple in Anamala, Tamil Nadu, where they conducted a fake marriage ceremony. Posing as her husband, Rajeev then sexually assaulted the woman multiple times. Over a period of time, they extorted ₹5 lakh from the victim's mother, convincing her of the legitimacy of the marriage.

THE FIFTH Syro-Malabar Church Major Episcopal Assembly has come to a close, culminating in a powerful call to prioritise the involvement of lay faithful in the mission areas of the Church. The final document, a result of three days of prayer and contemplation by 348 delegates, including bishops, priests, religious, and laity, outlined decisions that underscored the need for church reforms.

Centred around the main theme of contemporary Church life and mission, the assembly focused on faith training reformation, increasing laity participation in evangelisation, and strengthening community bonds. The assembly is a modern version of the *sab-hayogam* (Church council), an ancient tradition of the Marthoma Nasranis.

The Syro-Malabar Church, which has the second largest number of members among the Eastern Catholic Churches, seeks to intensify its evan-

gelisation along with its sister Churches, in the context it receiving pastoral authority across India. Through this conference, the Church, as an individual Church that is spread all over the world, strives to confront challenges with bravery and foster unity and brotherhood within its community. The assembly stresses the importance of Church members being active in political and social spheres.

The Church stands in solidarity with farmers' children facing displacement due to forest and environmental laws, as well as those affected by natural disasters and wildlife.

Additionally, the Assembly strongly urges the government to address its demands, including the immediate publication of the Justice J B Koshy Commission report and its implementation following discussions with Christian Churches. Minister Roshy Augustine, Assembly Committee convener Mar Polly Kannookadan, Church spokesperson Dr Chacko Kalamparampil, and others also spoke.
