WORST AIR QUALITY SINCE 2019, TOP COURT SAYS DON'T LIFT CURBS UNTIL ORDERS

Delhi gasps at 494 AQI, brace for more, say weather experts

NEW DELHI, NOVEMBER 18

DELHI'S AIR, already at toxic levels, turned worse on Monday, turning the city into a gas chamber. The Air Quality Index (AQI) deteriorated from 441 on Sunday to 494, which is its worst-ever on a par with the most polluted day recorded in 2019.

Since 2015, when the Central Pollution Control Board started maintaining air quality data, the AOI has deteriorated to this level only once before, on November 2, 2019.

CSMIA sees 4% rise in passengers for October compared to 2023

MUMBAI'S CHHATRAPATI Shivaji Maharaj International Airport (CSMIA) saw a 4% increase in passenger traffic in October, with 4.42 million passengers travelling through the airport compared to 4.25 million for the same month in 2023. The growth was driven particularly by a rise in international passenger numbers during the festive season

Data released for the month of October shows that domestic passenger numbers rose slightly, reaching 3.16 million this year from 3.11 million in October 2023. International traffic, however, saw a more notable rise, growing from 1.14 million passengers in October 2023 to 1.25 million in the same period in 2024.

Air traffic movements (ATMs) reflected mixed trends, with domestic ATMs declining from 21,349 in 2023 to 19,848 in 2024, while international ATMs increased to 7,222 from 7,110 the previous year.

The busiest day in October 2024 was on the 26th, when CSMIA handled 939 flights and 1,58,667 passengers. In 2023, the busiest day was October 2nd, with a record 148,014 passengers.

Delhi, Bangalore, and Goa remained the top domestic destinations like last year. The Mumbai-Delhi route continued to see strong demand, with 0.58 million passengers in October 2024, up from 0.55 million in 2023, which itself had seen a 22% growth compared to October 2022.

On the international front, Dubai, London, and Abu Dhabi held their positions as the most travelled destinations. The Middle East remained a dominant region for international traffic, accounting for 51% of the total international share in 2024. Asia contributed 23%, followed by Europe at 17%. London continued its upward trend in passenger preference, boosted by Virgin Atlantic's addition of a second daily flight in October 2024.

KTR lashes out at Rahul, says Cong grabbing tribal land in Telangana

BHARAT RASHTRA Samithi (BRS) on Monday accused the Congress government in Telangana of trying to usurp tribal farmland. BRS working president KT Rama Rao asked Congress leader Rahul Gandhi to "break his silence" on the "totalitarian" A Revanth

Reddy government. Flanked by Lambada women of Telangana, farmers and his own party leaders, Rao also known as KTR, said at a media conference held in New Delhi that scores of men and children were imprisoned in Revanth Reddy's constituency Kodangal's Lagacharla because they resisted eviction for the setting up of a pharma village.

"Atrocious violation of human rights. Atrocities, including outraging the modesty of women, have happened over the past nine months," KTR alleged.

The Congress government in Telangana has maintained that protests in the Tribal village are being orchestrated by the BRS. Government officials who went to acquire land in the village were attacked by BRS leaders there, Revanth Reddy had maintained.

KTR said that the state government has been trying to acquire farmland worth crores of rupees for a pharma venture of 3,000 acres. "They notified five villages and are trying to usurp the fruitful farmland which is worth crores at a throw away price," KTR said. He said that the condition of Lagacharla villagers are similar to those facing atrocin Manipur and ities Lakshadweep.

"Rahul Gandhi speaks about safeguarding the Constitution and standing with the Dalits,

Adivasis and OBCs. But he is silent when it comes to the plight of violated women in Lagacharla," KTR said. KTR accused Revanth Reddy's brother and son-in-law of having their

stake in the pharma village.

Rahul Gandhi has merely been paying lip service to the constitution without safeguarding the rights of those who are protected by the constitution – Dalits and Tribals, KTR accused. "I am confused sometimes. Rahul Gandhi says something and does something else. You promise a lot, speak a lot, but you do not understand the troubles of Lagacharla. You speak against crony-capitalism, then you allow crony capitalists to take away the land of farmers in Telangana," he said. He also asked Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge to respond to the allegations of women.

KTR said that the BJP too has been silent in this case. "Your silence indicates that you are complicit, Modiji," he said. "Now that the women have lodged complaints with the National Human Rights Commission, National SC Commission, National ST Commission and National Commission for Women, we hope that there emerges a solution to their crisis," he said.

Dileep, digital media head of BRS, was arrested today for allegedly posting videos of clashes between two groups that took place in Jainoor in Adilabad district in September A case against him was registered then with police accus-

Meanwhile, Konatham

ing him of fanning tensions by posting the videos on social media. BRS leader Dasoju Sravan said that Dileep was taken into custody after he went to Cyber Crime Police Station in response to a notice issued to him.

SC Collegium proposes Justice D Krishnakumar as CJ of Manipur **High Court**

THE SUPREME Court Collegium on Monday recommended the appointment of Madras High Court judge Justice D Krishnakumar as the next Chief Justice of the Manipur High Court.

The resolution signed by the three-member Collegium headed by Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna said that "hav ing regard to all relevant factors, the Collegium is of the considered view that Mr Justice D Krishnakumar is fit and suitable in all respects for being appointed as the Chief Justice of High Court of Manipur".

The vacancy will arise fol lowing the retirement of Manipur High Court Chief Justice Siddharth Mridul on November 21, 2024.

Recommending his elevation, the Collegium, also comprising Justices B R Gavai and Surya Kant, said that he was appointed as a judge of the Madras High Court on April 7, 2016, and is due to retire or May 21, 2025.

"He is the senior-most puisne judge (any judge of a high court other than the Chief Justice) in his parent high court and belongs to a backward community. Before his elevation as a judge of the high court, he had extensive practice in civil, constitutional and service matters in the high court, with specialisation in constitutional law. He is a competent judge with a sound legal acumen. He is endowed with high level of integrity and honesty," the Collegium said.

The Collegium added that it had also considered the fact that there is only one Chief Justice from the Madras High Court among the Chief Justices of the high courts at present.

'Jat face' Shokeen to replace Gahlot in AAP Cabinet

THE AAP Monday picked Nangloi Jat MLA Raghuvinder Shokeen as the replacement for its senior leader and Delhi transport minister Kailash Gahlot who switched to the BIP a day after he stepped down from the Cabinet and

Arvind Kejriwal-led party. Atwo-time MLA from Nangloi Jat constituency, Shokeen's presence in the Cabinet is expected to attract the rural voters to the AAP. "Shokeen is a Jat face and his presence will influence voters living in the rural parts of the city towards the AAP. Jat vote percentage is only 4-5 per cent in Delhi but his image will help garner more votes. He has a larger presence among people. Rural parts of Delhi also have a growing population of labourers from western UP and Bihar who have settled in unauthorised colonies. So, having him as a minister will have a major impact ahead of the polls," said a senior AAP leader. The leader added that Shokeen is often seen having discussions with the people

in his constituency. Shokeen joined the AAP in 2013-14. Before that, he was with the BJP and had served as a councillor with the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD), both as a BJP member and as an Independent, AAP leaders said he has been with the party since the day of its inception and has been working with senior leaders. A civil engineer by profession and an educationist, Shokeen runs several primary schools in villages

and several other places in Delhi. Party insiders said he is likely to get charge of the departments held by Gahlot and could be entrusted with the execution of the Mahila Samman Rashi scheme one of AAP's poll promises under which former chief minister Arvind Kejriwal announced an honorarium of Rs 1.000 per month to all women aged 18 to 60 — before the Assembly polls.

Report on decline in India's forest cover devoid of facts, Govt tells green tribunal

THE GLOBAL Forest Watch (GFW) project monitoring data that said India had lost 2.33 million hectares of tree cover is "devoid of facts, ground reality and internationally accepted norms", the Union Environment Ministry and the Forest Survey of India (FSI) have told the National Green Tribunal.

The Ministry and FSI made the remarks in a joint affidavit filed before the NGT's principal bench, which took suo motu cognisance of a report by The Indian Express on the GFW's data. The NGT bench had issued notices to the Ministry, FSI and the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) seeking their response on the substantial issues raised in the report.

The affidavit said that the

country's forest cover was reported in FSI's biennial India State of Forest Report (ISFR) and is based on internationally accepted criteria. However, it added, GFW's parameter for forest cover was not based on these internationally accepted criteria, and it might have a different methodology and definition for assessment.

"As per the ISFR 2021 compared to SFR 2001, there is a net increase of 58,891 sq km in forest cover and 14,277 sq km in tree cover in the country in the past two decades. Total increase in forest and tree cover of the country from SFR 2001 to ISFR 2021 is 74,168 sq km. Hence, as per the above report there is net gain in the forest and tree cover of the country," the affidavit stated. ISFR 2021 is the latest data, with the current forest survey cycle,

ISFR 2023, delayed so far. While preparing the ISFR, all

lands measuring more than one hectare with a tree canopy of more than 10%, irrespective of ownership and legal status, including orchards, bamboo and palm, are defined as forest cover, although tree patches of less than one hectare outside forest areas are also considered. Some experts have questioned this inclusion of tree-lined avenues, orchard plantations and even privately owned small areas in the forest cover.

According to the GFW data, the "tree cover" was derived from satellite data and it does not discern the land use, as per its methodology. It relies on a standardised definition of "forest" adopted by the Food and Agriculture Organisation, which takes into account biophysical criteria – tree height, canopy cover, extent of trees - and land

The affidavit also challenged

the GFW's findings that an average of 51 million tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent per year was released into the atmosphere as a result of the tree cover loss in India.

It said that the question of such CO2 emissions does not arise as there was no decrease in forest and tree cover.

"... the Global Forest Watch is devoid of the facts and ground reality and internationally accepted norms," the affidavit added.

According to the GFW data released in April 2024, India lost 2.33 million hectares or 6% of tree cover between 2001 and 2023 - 60% of it in five Northeastern states of Assam, Mizoram, Arunachal Pradesh. Nagaland and Manipur. It attributed around 18% of the total tree cover loss to the decline in humid primary forests by 4.14 lakh
